- Residents discussed and agreed that they would like to invite Anna Lei, Director of Care – Clinical and H.R. to the next Residents' Council meeting.

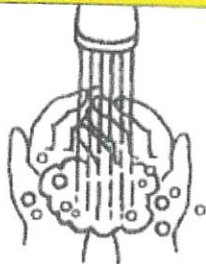
The meeting adjourned at 2:55 pm. The next meeting is on August 29th at 2:00 pm.



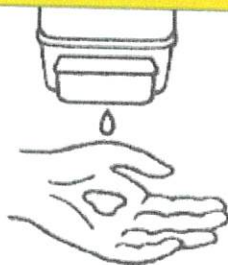

Hand Washing



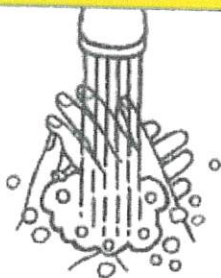
1. Wet hands.



2. Apply soap.



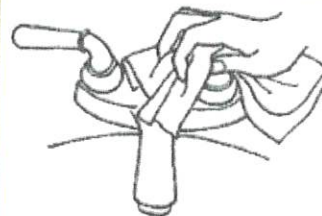
3. Lather for 15 seconds.

<p>Further to Gina's response, wandering is a behaviour we see in LTC and at Chester Village, in all home areas to varying degrees. Wandering by itself does not necessarily necessitate a move to the Diamond home area but rather, it would be based on the entire behavioural assessment of each case and on the recommendation of all the behavioural supports we are able to utilize in order to make that decision. The family is regularly involved in all these conversations.</p>
